

Monday, 15th: Today we meet at our Hotel in the lobby at 1 PM. Here, we will be greeted by our tour manager. After a light lunch on our own, we drive to the outskirts of Rome to visit St. Paul Outside the Walls, a beautiful Basilica dedicated to the Apostle of the Gentiles. Here we Celebrate our opening Mass. Afterwards, we tour the Basilica. Next, we will go for a tour within the Catacombs of St. Callixtus. Our visit through these hallowed burial grounds of the early Christians calls to mind the fundamentals of our Faith, depicted in part on the very walls of these underground chambers. Subsequently, we reboard our motorcoach that will take us to our Hotel for the next two nights. Tonight we have dinner together in the hotel.


D Rome



Tuesday, 16th: Holy Mass this morning will be in the Crypts in the magnificent Basilica of St. Peter in Vatican City. As we walk through and pray, our thoughts are flooded with events that have taken place here and the people who have worshiped in this great center of our Church. After Mass, we will first be guided on a Scavi tour of the necropolis below St. Peter's, as well as the Vatican Museum, especially the Sistine Chapel with its awesome frescoes by Michelangelo. Afternoon: This afternoon we can continue our own exploration of the Eternal City. Nearby the Vatican are religious articles shops. Maybe an ascent to the top of St. Peter's dome will be our quest. The reward is a fantastic view of Vatican City and Rome. This evening we sample delicious Italian cuisine outside the hotel.

Wednesday, 17th: This morning we will check out and will drive to the most illustrious church dedicated to Our Lady, the Basilica of St. Mary Major. In the Confessio beneath the high altar we can venerate the relics of the Crib that held the Infant Jesus. We see an ornate ceiling composed of gold from the new world as well as a striking mosaic apse. We then visit the nearby Basilica of St. John Lateran, the Cathedral Church of Rome, and see its richly adorned interior that inspires much devotion. We depart Rome South to Monte Cassino. Monte Cassino is considered by many to be the birthplace of monasticism in Western Europe. It was here in the 6th century that Benedict of Nursia founded the Benedictine Order, created the Benedictine Rule and established the first great monastery in Italy. Since its founding, the Abbey of Monte Cassino has grown into an immense affair, a masterpiece of architecture in a stunning mountain setting. After fifteen centuries it remains one of the chief centers of the Benedictines, and is especially revered by members of that Order, both because of its antiquity and historical importance and also due to the fact that Benedict of Nursia himself is entombed at the site. At the Abbey, we celebrate Mass. After Mass and a tour of the Abbey, we will have lunch before continuing to the Amalfi coast, where we will check in for dinner and overnight.

Thursday, 18th: This morning we awaken to views of the Mediterranean. Today we take most of the day off from our Pilgrimage to explore or relax. Stretching along the southern side of Italy's Sorrentine Peninsula, the Amalfi coast dazzles with its mysterious grottos, craggy cliffs and shimmering bays, we soak up views on the fabled route from artsy Positano to Amalfi. Ravello offers some respite from the crowds, plus the stunning Villa Cimbrone, which overlooks the Bay of Salerno. The historic section of Sorrento has winding streets filled with craftspeople. Capri is only a hydrofoil or ferry ride away. Later this afternoon, we will meet in the lobby to board our motor coach, where we will go to The Cathedral of Saints Philip and James (Cattedrale dei Santi Filippo e Giacomo), commonly known as the Sorrento Cathedral, located on Via Santa Maria della Pietà in

Sorrento. Here we Celebrate Mass. Afterwards, we will go for a Limoncello Tour at a local distillery. Here, we will see how limoncello is made, taste typical food and drink & learn about the local traditions. This will be paired with light food & escorted by a local tour guide. Afterwards, we make our way to a local Italian restaurant for dinner.


Friday, 19th: After breakfast, we go to The church of Santa Maria Assunta, a treasure right in the center of Positano. It is located in Piazza Flavio Gioia, just a few steps from the beach of Marina Grande and can only be reached on foot. According to historians, the church, which was initially consecrated to St. Vitus, was erected by Benedictine monks who were in a monastery near the urban center of medieval Positano in the 10th century. It is likely, however, that it had even earlier origins, dating back to the 8th century, when an early monastic settlement arose on the remains of a Roman villa, which can still be visited today just below the church. The abbey is first mentioned in a document written in a manuscript from the late 11th century; it had great prestige until the mid-15th century, after which it was gradually abandoned because of increasingly frequent raids by Cilento raiders. Finally, restoration work was undertaken in the late 1700s and the church returned to its original splendor. The most interesting and mysterious aspect of the church, however, is the Byzantine icon, the Black Madonna, that is preserved inside and is at the center of a fascinating story. Here we Celebrate Mass & have a guided tour of the Church. Our day is filled with leisure. We tour the towns of Positano & Sorrento. We will also have a Capri boat tour with a swimming opportunity in the blue grotto. A light lunch will be provided this day. Upon return to our hotel, the remaining part of the day is for you to explore, rest, and have dinner on your own on the beautiful Amalfi Coast.

Saturday, 20th: This morning is relaxful and time to yourself.. Breakfast will be served today but come at your leisure. Later this afternoon, we will reconvene to go to the Amalfi Cathedral. Certainly one of the highlights of the Amalfi Coast and one of Italy's finest churches, Amalfi Cathedral is located in Piazza del Duomo in the center of Amalfi. The beautiful Roman Catholic Cathedral is dedicated to the Apostle Saint Andrew whose remains are housed in the Crypt after being brought to Amalfi from Constantinople in 1206. As well as being the patron saint of Scotland and Russia, Saint Andrew is also the patron saint of Amalfi. Here we Celebrate Mass. Afterwards, we will stop by one of Amalfi's most well-regarded wineries. The winery is family owned and run, completely hands-on, and dedicated to sustainable agriculture. We will tour the facilities, from vineyards to wine cellars to get a full understanding of the viticulture of the coastal area. And then it will be time for a wine tasting of all the different wines produced paired with a dinner.

Sunday, 21st: We rise early this morning and have our breakfast. Afterwards we check out and drive to the east towards the Adriatic Coast. Late this morning we Celebrate Mass in the new Church of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina to see Padre Pio's Tomb. Following this we will go to the English Office for a talk on Padre Pio and have the opportunity to be blessed with his relics. We also have a guided tour of the town and explore the town where Padre Pio spent the last 50 years of his life. After you will have lunch on your own. Accordingly, we visit St. Michael's Cave where St. Michael the Archangel appeared. The First Apparition - The first apparition, known as the bull episode, is dated 490; it is most astonishing and tells the story of a rich lord who went in search of a bull of his herds, lost in the Gargano area; at last he found it on the top of the mountain kneeling down at the opening of a cave. Filled with anger, he shot an arrow against the rebellious animal, but instead of hitting the bull the arrow unaccountably wounded the foot of the wealthy man. Upset by the event, he went to see the Bishop
























who, after listening to the account of the extraordinary adventure, ordered three days of prayers and penance. As the third day ended, the Archangel Michael appeared to the Bishop and spoke to him: "I am the Archangel Michael and I am always in the presence of God. This cavern is sacred to me, I have chosen it; I myself am its watchful custodian... There where the rock opens wide the sins of men can be forgiven... What is asked here in prayer will be granted. Therefore, go to the mountain and dedicate the grotto to the Christian religion". Second Apparition - The second apparition, known as the victory episode, is linked to a memorable victory of the town of Siponto against the enemy troops; the complete victory, foretold by the Archangel during His apparition to the holy Bishop Lawrence Majorano, took place on May 8th and the Longobards attributed it to the intercession and help of the Archangel.

Third Apparition - The third apparition, also called the Dedication episode, is linked to the beginning of the cult on the Gargano when all the Apulian bishops went in procession to the Holy Grotto and they found that a primitive altar had already been erected, as announced by the Archangel to Lawrence Maiorano; moreover, according to the legend, they found St. Michael's footprint in the rock.

Gargano is one of the most advanced eastward lands of Italy and so, thanks to its geographical position and the fame acquired for these apparitions, the Byzantines held it under their dominion together with some other regions of the Adriatic coast. During this period the Sanctuary structure was very different from the current one. Pilgrims arrived at the shrine from the Carbonara valley through a portico and a gallery that gave way to the irregular and deep cavern. Then, in this period, according to the oriental liturgy, St. Michael was venerated as the one who presents the souls of the dead to the divine throne and as a healer of illnesses (Apollo was a healer god) rather than as a great warrior. It was very famous for the so-called "drop": a miraculous water that dripped from the rock of the cavern and, according to the tales, healed every kind of disease. Tuesday, 23rd: Today is a full rest day. We enjoy down time at the Villa. We can relax at the pool, walk through the woods surrounding the estate or play a game of tennis on our private court. You can even plan your own private excursion. At 5 PM, we will Celebrate Holy Mass on the Estate. After, we are treated to a Private dinner with wine and other drinks. B & D Borgo San Luigi



Wednesday, 24th: After breakfast, we drive to Assisi. Our first stop in the plains below Assisi, we go inside St. Mary of the Angels Basilica. There, we visit the Porziuncola, the little chapel where Francis gathered his followers. Following this, we drive up to the Medieval town of Assisi, were we reach the Basilica of St. Clare, Foundress of the Poor Clare nuns, and see her tomb. In the upper chapel we venerate the Crucifix that was originally located in San Damiano church. Here we have time for prayer and reflection. Our Lord from that crucifix spoke to Francis the command to "Rebuild My Church." After that we visit Blessed Carlo Acutis. He is an English-born Italian Catholic youth and website designer who is best known for documenting Eucharistic miracles and the approved Marian apparitions around the world and cataloging them onto a website which he created before his death from



leukemia. We have time to learn about this teenager's life and venerate his tomb. Next we celebrate Holy Mass in the Basilica of St. Francis at the Saint's Tomb. Our walking tour will show us first the magnificent frescoes by Giotto in the Basilica that depict the life of the saint. As we walk up to the main piazza, we are struck by the fact that all the buildings are of sandstone with a slight rose hue. Finally, we will visit the ancient facade of the bishop's residence, unearthed recently. One excavation bears special significance for the life of St. Francis. It's a door, dating to the Middle Ages, that leads from the old square into the bishop's residence. This door was the door of decision for Francis, the door of conversion, because when he came here, he decided to renounce all of his earthly goods. Here, we pass through this door in hope that as we walk through it and to reflect on our lives, and to say, 'Where and how am I living? For whom or for what am I living?' Today, we have time to explore this beautiful town on our own. Lunch will be on your own. After time in Assisi, we make our way to a Tuscan Winery where we have a dinner paired with some of the vintages that the area is known for.

Thursday, 25th: This morning is on our own. After lunch in the afternoon, a few minutes drive from our Villa is Siena, a delightful medieval town, but important because of the connection with St. Catherine, Doctor of the Church and reformer of the Papacy. Our first stop is Basilica di San Domenico, one of the churches in Siena, Tuscany, which holds extreme significance for its people. It is often referred to as Basilica Cateriniana. St. Catherine of Siena used to live in a nearby house. Many relics of St. Catherine are included in the church. These must be viewed to get a true sense of that era. Here, we Celebrate Mass and have an opportunity to venerate this Great Saint's Relics. After our guided tour in the Basilica, our walking tour takes us into the Piazza del Campo and to the Gothic Cathedral of dark and light marble. Afterwards, we are treated to dinner at one of the better Italian restaurants.

Friday, 26th: This morning is on our own. Mid morning, we drive directly North to Florence. Our guided city tour of Florence, includes a visit to the Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore and its masterfully done bronze Baptistry doors worthy to be called by Michelangelo the "Gates of Paradise." Here we Celebrate Holy Mass. We tour the Piazza della Signoria and its Loggia, Santa Croce filled with the tombs of the famous. And finally, we will visit the Uffizi Gallery located in the heart of Florence. The Gallery hosts works of art by great Italian artists such as Botticelli, Giotto, Cimabue, Michelangelo, Leonardo da Vinci and Raffaello, just to name a few of the most famous. Its large collection has works from all centuries but a large part dates back to the periods between the 12th and 17th centuries. Onward we enjoy a breathtaking view of Florence from Piazzale Michelangelo. The rest of the day is at leisure for exploring on one's own. The shops are laden with jewelry of Florentine gold and silver, exquisite leather goods and bargains of all kinds. Afterwards, we will have dinner this evening at a Florentine Steakhouse. Saturday, 27th: We motor to the southwest and reach the beautiful hill town of Orvieto. It is here that in 1263 Pope Urban IV proclaimed the authenticity of a Eucharistic miracle that the Sacred Host had bled during a Mass celebrated in nearby Bolsena. We can still see the Corporal associated with the miracle enshrined within the Cathedral of Orvieto. From this event the Church instituted the Feast of Corpus Christi. The Cathedral's façade is adorned with a splendid and world famous mosaic. At 11:00 AM we will celebrate the Eucharist in its Chapel of the Corporal. We continue traveling south to Rome, the Eternal City, and arrive to check into our hotel. In the afternoon on our way to Rome, the next stop is a well regarded Winery Estate where we have our Farewell luncheon / dinner paired with wine. Other drinks will be made available as well. After our festive evening



we make our way to the Hilton right next to the airport. The hotel is close enough to walk to the check in counter of your flight.
