Monday, September 7: Our sacred pilgrimage, guided by the gentle hand of Father Anthony Yates, commences as we board an overnight flight from St. Louis to Lisbon, Portugal. With hearts brimming with anticipation, we surrender to God's call, embarking on a transformative journey through the hallowed lands of Portugal, Spain, and France, where the presence of the Divine and the intercession of the Saints will envelop us. D & B Served aboard the Plane **Tuesday, September 8:** We arrive in Lisbon, greeted by the golden light of this ancient city, a testament to God's creation. A panoramic motorcoach tour unveils Lisbon's vibrant charm, from its rolling hills to the Tagus River serene flow, inviting us to marvel at the beauty bestowed upon this land. Our spiritual journey begins at the majestic Cathedral, its ancient stones whispering centuries of devotion, and continues at the **Church of St. Anthony**, where we kneel in prayer, honoring the saint's fiery preaching and boundless charity. From Lisbon, we travel to Santarém, where Father Yates celebrates Mass at St. Stephen's Church, home to a miraculous **Eucharistic host that bled in the 13th century**, a profound reminder of Christ's living presence in the Blessed Sacrament. As evening falls, we arrive in Fátima, the sacred heart of Marian devotion, and settle into our accommodations, our souls already stirred by the day's graces.

Wednesday, September 9: we rise in Fátima, enveloped by the peace of this holy sanctuary where Our Lady appeared to three shepherd children in 1917. Father Yates celebrates Mass at the main outdoor chapel or within the Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary, its golden mosaics reflecting the glory of God. The Eucharist strengthens us for a day of pilgrimage through Fátima's sacred sites. We visit the Fátima Museum, where artifacts and stories illuminate the apparitions' enduring message of prayer and penance. In the nearby hamlet of Aljustrel, we walk the humble paths of the shepherd children's hometown, their simplicity a model of holiness. Along the Via Sacra, we pray the Stations of the Cross, each step uniting us to Christ's redemptive suffering. In a private chapel, we rest in Eucharistic Adoration, gazing upon the Lord who gazes upon us with infinite love. As twilight descends, we join the candlelight procession, our flickering flames weaving a tapestry of light and faith as we pray the Rosary with pilgrims from across the globe, before retiring for the night.

Thursday September 10: We gather in the quiet intimacy of a small Fátima chapel, where Father Yates offers a private Mass, the stillness amplifying the sacredness of the moment. With hearts full, we depart for Salamanca, Spain, a city radiant with history and faith. A walking tour reveals its treasures: the bustling Plaza Mayor, alive with the joy of communal life; La Clerecía, a Baroque masterpiece soaring toward heaven; La Casa de las Conchas, adorned with scallop shells symbolizing pilgrimage; and the ancient University of Salamanca, a cradle of wisdom. We pause at the Roman Bridge, its arches standing firm through centuries, and pray in the sacred spaces of Iglesia de San Marcos and Iglesia de San Martín. At the Old and New Cathedrals, we stand in awe of their intricate Gothic and Renaissance beauty, offering prayers of gratitude. After a hearty dinner, we rest in Salamanca, our souls nourished by the day's encounters.

Friday, September 11: We journey to **Alba de Tormes**, where founded a **Carmelite Monastery. Father Yates celebrates Mass in this holy place**, and we venerate the saints incorrupt heart and left arm, preserved in the monastery's museum as a testament to God's enduring miracles. We continue to **Ávila**, a medieval city encircled by perfectly preserved walls, a fortress of faith. Here, we visit the Cathedral, its robust Romanesque structure echoing the strength of the Church, and the **Basilica of San Vicente**, where martyrs' relics inspire courage. At the Convent of the Incarnation, we tread where St. Teresa deepened her mystical union with God, her writings still guiding souls today. Our day concludes in **Burgos**, where we dine and **explore the breathtaking Gothic Cathedral**, its spires piercing the heavens and its chapels inviting quiet reflection, before retiring for the night. **B & D Burgos**

Saturday, September 12: We travel through the majestic Pyrenees Mountains, their peaks a hymn to God's grandeur, arriving in Lourdes, France. After a simple lunch en route, Father Yates celebrates Mass in a chapel within the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception, its golden crown gleaming above the Grotto. After, we watch a documentary at the information center, deepening our understanding of Our Lady's apparitions to St. Bernadette in 1858. At the Grotto of Massabielle, where Mary proclaimed herself the Immaculate Conception, we kneel in prayer, the rock worn smooth by countless pilgrims' hands. We participate in the Water Ritual, letting the spring's gentle flow, discovered by Bernadette, symbolize our cleansing through grace, though full immersion is not available at this time. In the evening, we join the candlelight procession, our voices rising in the Rosary as we walk with Mary, before dining and resting in Lourdes.



Sunday, September 13: We begin the day of profound spiritual renewal. Mass will be celebrated at the Grotto, where the Virgin's presence lingers, fills us with peace. We visit the Boly Mill, St. Bernadette's birthplace, and the Cachot, the cramped cell where her family lived in poverty, her humility a beacon of holiness. In a private space, we engage in spiritual exercises and Eucharistic Adoration, resting in the silent embrace of the Lord. We participate again in the Water Ritual and return to the Grotto for prayer, then walk the Stations of the Cross, each station carved into the hillside, drawing us into Christ's passion. The evening brings another candlelight procession and Rosary, our hearts united with pilgrims worldwide. We conclude with a joyful dinner at a local restaurant, celebrating the fellowship of this sacred journey.

Monday, September 14: We rise early for a high-speed train from Lourdes to Paris, departing at 7:00 AM and arriving at Gare du Nord by 11:49 AM. A motorcoach awaits, and we proceed to the Basilica of Sacré-Cœur, perched atop Montmartre like a beacon of Christ's love. Father Yates celebrates Mass in this sanctuary dedicated to the Sacred Heart, its mosaics radiating divine mercy. We tour the basilica, lingering in its sacred silence, and, if time allows, participate in Perpetual Adoration, adoring the Eucharistic Lord who never ceases to love us. We then travel to Lisieux, near the Carmelite convent of St. Thérèse, where we dine and rest, the Little Flower's presence already stirring our souls. B & D Lisieux

Tuesday, September 15: We immerse ourselves in the legacy of **St. Thérèse of Lisieux**, the saint of the "Little Way." **At the Carmelite convent**, we pray at her resting place and explore the museum, where her relics and writings reveal a life of simple, radical love. At **Les Buissonnets**, her family home, we glimpse the warmth of her childhood, shaped by faith. Father Yates **celebrates Mass in the crypt of the Basilica of St. Thérèse, where her parents, Sts. Louis and Zélie Martin**, rest, their holiness a model for families. In the afternoon, we visit the **Normandy Landing Beaches**, standing solemnly at the **Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial**, where crosses mark the sacrifices of those who gave their lives for freedom, prompting reflection on Christ's ultimate sacrifice. We return to Lisieux for dinner and another night's rest.



Wednesday, September 16: We journey to Chartres, where Father Yates celebrates Mass in the awe-inspiring Chartres Cathedral, its stained-glass windows casting jewel-toned light, each pane a story of salvation. A guided tour reveals the cathedral's sacred art, including the Veil of the Virgin, a relic cherished by pilgrims. After lunch in Chartres, we continue to Paris for a panoramic bus tour, marveling at the Eiffel Tower's elegance, Les Invalides' golden dome, the Arc de Triomphe's grandeur, the Champs-Élysées' vibrancy, and La Madeleine's classical beauty. Our spiritual path leads to the Chapel of the Miraculous Medal, where we pray at the











site of Our Lady apparitions to St. Catherine Labouré, and to the tomb of St. Vincent de Paul, whose charity transformed lives. We check into our Paris hotel, dine, and rest, grateful for the day's blessings.

Thursday, September 17: We hope to Celebrate Mass at Notre-Dame, pending availability, its restored spires a symbol of resurrection after the 2019 fire. We tour this Gothic masterpiece, its rose windows radiant with divine light, and visit Sainte-Chapelle, where stained glass transforms sunlight into a prayer. The afternoon is free to explore Paris, with assistance available for visiting the Eiffel Tower, the Louvre's artistic treasures, the Musée d'Orsay's Impressionist masterpieces, or other sites that call to the heart. As evening falls, we gather for a farewell dinner cruise on the Seine around 7:00 PM, the city's lights reflecting on the water as we give thanks for the graces of this pilgrimage, our hearts overflowing with gratitude. Friday, September 18: We depart Paris for our return flight to St. Louis, carrying the spiritual treasures of this sacred journey. The encounters with God, the Blessed Virgin, and the saints have woven a tapestry of faith in our souls, transforming us forever as we return home, ready to live our faith with renewed fervor.
