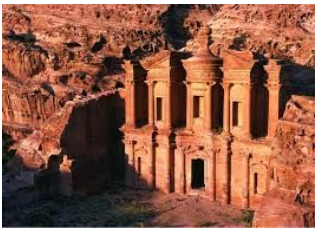


**Monday, January 13:** Depart St. Louis for Tel Aviv.

**Tuesday, January 14:** Our Plane Lands at Tel Aviv airport & by midday and after lunch, we board our motor coach and head South to Aqaba. Here we will have two border crossings. One into Israel then into Egypt. Once in Egypt, we meet our driver and guide who escorts us to the St. Catherine, where we have an overnight and dinner. **D St. Catherine**



**Wednesday, January 15:** We rise early in the morning, climb Jabal Mousa or Moses Mountain. Mount Sinai is the mountain where Moses received the Ten Commandments. After our early morning hike, we descend for breakfast at the hotel. Visit St. Catherine's Monastery. Saint Catherine's Monastery, officially "Sacred Monastery of the God-Trodden Mount Sinai", lies at the mouth of a gorge at the foot of Mount Sinai. The monastery complex built around the site of the Burning Bush and the Well of Jethro developed across the centuries. The monastery has never been destroyed in all its history, and thus it can be said to have preserved intact the distinctive qualities of its Greek and Roman heritage. After lunch, we drive to Taba where we have the rest of the day free to enjoy the Red Sea & resort where we will have our overnight. Dinner and overnight in Taba. **B & D Taba**



**Thursday, January 16:** After a restful night, we have breakfast at the hotel in Taba. We then take a short drive to the border to Israel, then to the Jordanian border. We have arranged VIP assistance for the bridge crossing at the border of Israel and Jordan. This will take about 1 - 2 hours to cross the border. After about three hours drive North. Soon, we enter Petra so that you can experience an unforgettable tour of this "rose red" City of Petra, highlighted by its most beautiful monument - the Treasury. It is carved out of the solid red rock from the side of the mountain. We continue further into this magnificent city, seeing sites such as The Royal Tombs or the Theater. After a light lunch, we will have the opportunity to explore on our own, perhaps walking to Upper Petra to see the Monastery or maybe taking time out by resting at our Hotel. After our day in Petra we return to our hotel for dinner and overnight. **B & D Petra**



**Friday, January 17:** This morning we wake up for a drive North & enter the city of **Madaba**. Madaba is located on a hilltop, overlooking panoramic views and the Dead Sea, and near Mount Nebo, a famous pilgrim site. The city hosts the largest Christian population in Jordan. Our visit is centered around St. John the Baptist Church. Here we have a brief tour of the crypt as well as the mosaics. If you climb the Bell tower, you will have sweeping views of Madaba. After a brief lunch, we make our way to **St George's Greek Orthodox Church & Mosaic Map**. The Mosaics were crafted in AD 560, the map has 157 captions (in Greek) depicting all the major biblical sites of the Middle East, from Egypt to Palestine. On our way we stop at the Monastery on top of Mount Nebo. You may remember, after 40 years leading the headstrong Israelites in the desert, Moses stood on the windswept summit of Mount Nebo and viewed the Promised Land of Canaan – after having been told by God "you shall not cross over there". On a clear day, today's pilgrims can see the panorama Moses viewed: The Dead Sea, the Jordan River valley, Jericho, Bethlehem and the distant hills of Jerusalem. Before reaching our final destination, we stop at **Bethany Beyond the Jordan**. Also known as **Al-Maghtas**, officially known as **Baptism Site "Bethany Beyond the Jordan"**, is an archaeological World Heritage site in Jordan, on the east bank of the Jordan River, considered to be the original location of the Baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist and venerated as such since at least the Byzantine period. Here, we take time to reflect on our Baptismal Promises. After our guided tour we check into our **Hotel on the Dead Sea**. This afternoon we can enjoy some free time on the shore or relaxing overlooking the Sea from the upper veranda & in taking this most beautiful landscape. **B & D Dead Sea**





**Saturday, January 18:** This morning after breakfast, we depart for **Jerash**. The ruined city of Jerash is Jordan's largest and most interesting Roman site, and a major tourist drawcard. Its imposing ceremonial gates, colonnaded avenues, temples and theaters all speak to the time when this was an important imperial center. Here, we see sites such as the striking **Hadrian's Arch**, also known as the **Triumphal Arch**, which was built in AD 129 in honor of the visit of Emperor Hadrian. Behind the arch is the hippodrome, which hosted chariot races in front of up to 15,000 spectators. Other sites include South Gate, **Temple of Zeus**, the **South Theatre** that was built in the 1st century with a capacity of 5000 spectators and many more sites. After our guided tour, we are transferred into Israel and transferred to our hotel for dinner & overnight on the Sea of Galilee.

**Sunday, January 19:** After Breakfast, we travel towards **Caesarea Maritima**, where we will have a brief visit to the magnificent city with **Roman, Byzantine, and Crusader ruins**. Here we will elaborate on the story of the baptism of Cornelius, the first gentile convert into Christianity (Acts 10), and on the travels of **Paul** – those events that led Caesarea Maritima to become the springboard of Christianity to the West. Continue to **Mount Carmel** and consider the contest between the **Prophet Elijah** and the false prophets of Baal (I Kings 18), discussing the reasons why the Prophet chose that place for the contest, and the lessons we learn from the story. Lunch on your own. We continue on to **Megiddo**, the Fortress City of King Solomon, later built again by King Ahab. The books of Daniel and Revelation will come alive as we study about the final **Battle of Armageddon**, while viewing the **Plains of Jezreel**. Next we travel to Nazareth where we will climb the Mount of Precipice, the brow of the hill on which the city was built (Luke 4). There we will reflect on the rejection of Jesus by his family and friends in **Nazareth**. While there overlooking the Armageddon Valley, we will also discuss the reasons why we believe this will be the setting for the final battle between good and evil mentioned in Revelation 16:16. Our final stop before we go to the **Sea of Galilee**, we ascend the heights of **Mt. Tabor**, where Jesus took Peter, James and John and was gloriously Transfigured in their sight. Soon after, we depart to the Sea of Galilee passing Cana of Galilee where Jesus performed his first miracle changing water into wine. Upon arrival, we check into your hotel on the Sea of Galilee.

**Monday, January 20:** After a buffet breakfast, we begin our day with a drive North to the **Golan Heights & Caesarea Philippi**, where in response to the profession of faith spoken by Peter, Jesus promised him leadership in His Church—that He would give him the **“Keys to the Kingdom.”** We then drive South to the Sea of Galilee and at a lunch stop we are provided with a local favorite called **“St. Peter Fish.”** Nearby, we visit the town of **Magdala**. Here we tour an ancient synagogue and Chapel where various women of the Bible are highlighted. We then venture to **Tabgha (Seven Springs)**, where our first stop is at the site of the **Multiplication of Loaves and Fishes**. Next we visit the **Church of the Primacy of Peter**, the place where **Our Lord bestowed upon Peter the Keys to the Kingdom.** Next we will ascend the **Mount of Beatitudes** and discuss the **Sermon on the Mount**. We will then visit **Capernaum**, Jesus' Galilean ministry base. There we will see the house of Peter's mother in law, in addition to other ruins of the village. We will stand in the ruins of the ancient synagogue where Jesus was confronted by the demoniac. We will then visit the ancient boat museum containing a recently-discovered 2000-year old fishing boat. We will then **sail on the Sea of Galilee** on a replica of that boat. Our last stop of the day will be to the **Jordan River** at **Yardenit** where you will get a chance to **renew baptismal vows** before we return to our hotel.

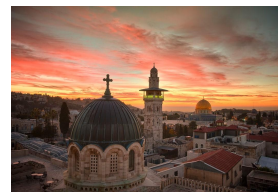

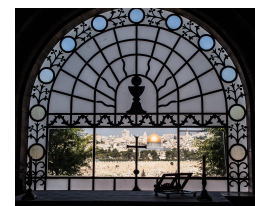
**Tuesday, January 21:** After a buffet breakfast, we leave the area of Galilee, following the Jordan Valley Road to **Beth Shean**, the capital of the **Decapolis**. There we will see the ruins of the Roman and Byzantine cities. We will also discuss the demise of **King Saul** and his sons, whose bodies were hanged on the walls of Beth Shean. We will then continue traveling south to the actual location where **John the Baptist was baptizing on the Jordan River**. **Jericho** will be our next stop, where we will visit the Tel of Jericho with its ancient ruins, pointing out what possibly could be the foundations of the ramparts that Joshua and the Israelites brought

down. Later we have a lunch in **Jericho** at **Al-Rawdah**. We then make our way to Bethlehem for dinner and overnight. **B, L & D Bethlehem**

**Wednesday, January 22:** After a buffet breakfast, we will begin our day in **Bethlehem**, the birthplace of Jesus. We begin with a visit to the Shepherds fields where the angels appeared to the shepherds and announced the birth of Our Lord. These fields are also the setting of the **Book of Ruth**. We will then travel to the **Church of the Nativity** and view the actual place where **Our Lord was born**. Time will then be given to shop for olive wood and other items. **After lunch with Christian Families**, we drive to Jerusalem with an orientation over the holy city from the **Mount of Olives**, pointing out important locations within the Old City, connecting them with Biblical stories and prophecies about the return of Jesus. We will then walk down the **Palm Sunday Procession road** to the **Garden of Gethsemane**, where the passion of Jesus began. We will then visit the **Southern Wall excavations** where ruins of the retaining walls of the **Temple Mount** are still visible. We will then gather at the teaching steps, the main entrance to the Temple where Rabbis met and taught their disciples. We check into our hotel in Jerusalem. **B & D Jerusalem**



**Thursday, January 23:** After a buffet breakfast, we begin our day visiting **Masada**; the fortress built by **King Herod the Great** and made famous by the Zealots in 73/74 AD with the standoff against the Romans. We visit the fortress and see the ruins that are considered a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. We then continue to **En Gedi**, the oasis in the desert where **the meeting between David and King Saul took place** (I Samuel 24) and where many of the psalms were written by David. After lunch, we visit **Qumran**, the location where the **Dead Sea Scrolls** were found by a Bedouin boy back in 1947. There we will see the caves and other buildings that the Essenes, the group of Jews who wrote the scrolls, lived. You will also be able to experience floating in the **Dead Sea**. **B & D Jerusalem**



**Friday, January 24:** After a buffet breakfast, we begin our day entering the Old City and a visit to the **Western Wall**, a section of the Western retaining wall of the Temple Mount, and Judaism's holiest site. We will ascend the **Temple Mount**, discussing its connection to both the Old and New Testaments. We will also discuss why it is considered the third holiest site in Islam. Then we will be visiting the **Western Wall Tunnels and Excavations** site. Here we will walk on the very stones where Jesus trod Herod's "second temple", and see the place where our Savior taught the scriptures. Leaving the Temple Mount, we will visit the **Church of St. Anne's**, a perfectly intact Crusader church. It is a wonderful place to gather and sing a song (sometimes with fellow Christians from all over the world). There, we will also visit the **Pools of Bethesda** where the healing at the pool took place (John 5). We will then walk the **Via Dolorosa** (The Way of Suffering), the actual path that Jesus walked from the **Antonia Fortress** to the **crucifixion site**. We will also visit the **Church of the Holy Sepulchre**, Jesus' tomb. After lunch in the Old City, we travel to the **Israel Museum**, where we will visit the Second Temple Period Model of Jerusalem, a 1:50 scale model of the city from the year 66 AD. We will also visit the Shrine of the Book where the Dead Sea Scrolls are on exhibit. In addition to the archeological section where many artifacts are displayed, we will play special attention to items that relate to Bible history. We then return to our hotel. **B & D Jerusalem**



**Saturday, January 25:** **Upper Room - Caiaphas house - Jewish Quarter - Garden Tomb - Jerusalem** After a buffet breakfast, we begin our day with a visit to the original location of the city of Jerusalem, going back in history 3000 years. We will visit the **Upper Room**, the place of the **Last Supper** and also the home of the **High Priest, Caiaphas**. After lunch, we will visit the **Garden Tomb**, where we will worship together and celebrate communion. We return to our hotel to get ready to go out for our **farewell Dinner at Eucalyptus**. Then we will travel to the airport in the evening and return home with unforgettable memories, amazing new friends and a life-changing understanding of Where Jesus Walked. **B & D Jerusalem**
